

# CPT CODE FACTS FOR COACHING PATIENTS

*Clinicians and clinical practitioners with NSHC Health Coach Certification will continue to integrate their health coaching skills into practice using CPT and HCPCS Codes currently in use.*

## CPT CATEGORY III CODES FOR COACHING

*The American Medical Association (AMA) determines if a Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) Code is added for a service or procedure. The AMA does not determine if or when a CPT Code is reimbursable, nor does it endorse any service or procedure represented in any code released.*

*The AMA releases CPT Category III Codes, such as the new Health and Well-Being Coaching codes, as temporary codes to allow for data collection of the use of emerging technologies, services, procedures, and service paradigms over a 5-year period. Category III codes are also intended to substantiate use or to provide documentation for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approval process.*

## ARE THE NEW CATEGORY III COACHING CODES REIMBURSABLE?

*Each individual payer, i.e., Medicare and Medicaid, HMOs, PPOs, and other insurance companies, decide if and when to reimburse for a CPT code, and which providers may use the code for billing according to the Payer's own individual reimbursement policies.*

## BILLING FOR COACHING AS A PROVIDER

*Since the onset of HIPAA qualified Providers are required to have a National Provider Identifier (NPI) number to bill for services. An NPI number is assigned by Medicare and Medicaid Services. There are two categories of health care providers who have NPI numbers for billing.*

- 1. **Individuals:** Physicians, Chiropractors, Advanced Practice Nurses, Dentists, Pharmacists, Nurse Midwives, and Physical Therapists*
- 2. **Organizations:** Group Practices, Clinics, Hospitals, HMOs, Home Health, Ambulance Companies, Laboratories, Nursing Homes, Pharmacies, Residential Treatment Centers, and DME Suppliers.*
